
## September 2021- Top Highlights



- Law enforcement personnel discharged their firearms on 28 occasions (while on official duty) in September, an 18% decrease from August.
- ❖ 394 general crime incidents recorded in September, an 8% drop from the 428 reported in August.
- Bungoma county accounted for 47% of all motorcycle thefts reported in
- Laikipia county recorded the highest number of incidents of communal violence in September.
- There was a 20% reduction in the mob retribution cases recorded in September compared to August.
- \* Two Violent Extremism incidents recorded in September with no deaths of civilians or security forces.




### REINVENT VIOLENCE AND CRIME TREND ANALYSIS

This public document contains an extract from REINVENT's violence monitoring tool. The REINVENT programme maintains an extensive database of security incidents recorded across Kenya, grouped into six categories: crime, public disorder, violent extremism, sexual and gender-based violence, mob retribution and intercommunal violence. In addition, the tool monitors law enforcement activity. Depending on the availability of the data, the tool considers the target of the violence, the use of weapons, casualty figures, the actors involved and the motives. Emerging trends in both time and space are identified using graphs and maps alongside analysis
